First, we have a lot of work to do and would sure appreciate your help! Look for more information inside about opportunities to volunteer. Secondly,

many camps are beginning to fill, and others are already full. This is exciting because these kids and families will make memories that last a lifetime and learn more about the God who loves them!

One of the things parents love about IPoint is our commitment to safety. We've worked hard the past year to implement procedures and new methods to help ensure that camp is as safe as possible during the pandemic. Did you hear about the encouraging news that recently came out of Duke University? The study, appearing online Feb. 3 in the *Journal of Pediatrics*, added to the growing body of literature documenting nominal spread of the pandemic virus among children in group settings when known mitigation measures are strictly followed. The study looked at 54 camps in North Carolina last March-August when community spread was increasing. Of the 6,830 campers and staff members followed, researchers found only 19 cases of COVID-19, and all but two of those were infected outside the camp. We are confident we can offer safe camp experiences this summer!

Point at Twin Oaks! Spitzer Lake sunsets have been a favorite for many r

Spitzer Lake sunsets have been a favorite for many, many years. Scores of people have photos of a brilliantly colored sky with the sun descending below the hills across the lake. Now, we are facing a new sunset – the sunset of the use of that property as camp. In the last issue of *Inspirations*, we announced that "camp is going to have to continue exclusively at the Twin Oaks site" due to high water. That is, indeed, true. The lake, which has been rising for 30 years, has made it impossible for the site to be used as a camp any longer. Several buildings have been significantly damaged, and all possible avenues for mitigation have been explored without solution.



Following much prayer, study, and discussion, the board of directors and camp leadership intend that the property must now be sold. Efforts are underway to liquidate items that cannot be used at the new location, with an online auction to be held this spring. A couple of parcels we've named the Ironwood Property, along with the house where our former food service director lived, are currently listed for sale. It is expected that the main camp property will be divided into parcels and offered for sale in the coming months as well.

We grieve this loss yet praise and thank God for how He provided and used this special site to tell of His wondrous works to generations. Thousands of people of all ages point back to a time in their lives when God met them in a powerful fashion on the shores of Spitzer Lake. Friendships were begun, people were called into lives of ministry, young adults were trained, relationships were reconciled, and lives were eternally impacted as people spent time at camp. What a precious and enduring legacy! What a marvel to see how God has provided a brand new property and to move forward in anticipation of how He will use the Twin Oaks site to carry on His work.


CAMPAIGN UPDATE:

Many years ago, a young boy arrived at camp, unaware that his life would be altered forever because of that week. He came to trust Christ as his savior, launching him on a life-long trajectory of ministry that has taken him around the world as an evangelist and missionary for the past 20 years. This is just one story of the impact of this ministry. Thousands of people can point to a similar experience at camp, with God using their time at IPoint to impact their lives forever. So, when it became apparent five years ago that Inspiration Point lacked the capacity to be able to serve all the kids who wanted and needed to attend camp, we began seeking more property since there was no way to expand at the Spitzer Lake site.

After an extensive search of more than 70 properties, including resorts, farms, bare land, and other camps, we were led to Twin Oaks, a private estate a short distance from Spitzer. The property met all 26 criteria the board identified a new site should have, and we were able to close on the property in August 2018.

Little did we know at the time how critical Twin Oaks would be! In fact, without it the ministry of Inspiration Point would have ceased to exist when high water at Spitzer Lake made that site unusable. It has been a scramble to plan, acquire permits, build infrastructure and buildings, and remodel existing facilities so camp could take place. But God's faithful hand has been on the massive project all along, and now we eagerly anticipate hosting our first youth camps this summer.

In order to pay for the purchase and to build all that was necessary for Twin Oaks to become the sole location of ministry, Inspiration Point embarked on a capital campaign to secure \$8.5 million in cash and pledges. We praise and thank God for already providing \$5 million. While that is certainly encouraging, there is a long way to go. The amount already raised has been provided by approximately 350 individuals, couples, and businesses. Camp needs gifts and pledges from 1,000 people being as generous as they're able in order to pay for the property and remaining projects.

One of our generous donors declared, "I support this camp because I know my money gets a bang for the buck. Lives are changed forever at camp, and I want to be a part of that."

ADDING MOTEL-LIKE ROOMS:

In order to solve the capacity issues at the original site, we planned that Twin Oaks was would have a 100-bed capacity, providing space for IPoint's youngest campers. Then the rising water made the Spitzer site unusable for camp, and the Twin Oaks property required rapid expansion so that there would be capacity for all Inspiration Point events. Part of the solution came in moving the two Oak Point buildings from Spitzer to Twin Oaks, which provided an immediate addition of 80 beds. That move also made it possible to add a lower level to each of those buildings.

We are making progress! When completed, each of the lower levels of the two buildings will have three bedrooms with private baths, and a common kitchenette and living space, making these rooms a wonderful space for family camps, adults, and volunteers, as well as overflow housing for youth camps and retreats.

Construction moves forward as donations for the project are received. Thanks to a couple of churches and some individual donors, we are now ready for mechanical rough-in. We still need an additional \$125,000 to finish the project and begin using these rooms.

"Mom, I cried a little the first night, but my counselor prayed with me, and I was better." Tori was a Trailblazer, and this was the first of her many times at camp. It's difficult to fully understand how my time at camp has impacted my career, my support circle, and how I see the world. When I first signed on to work at camp, I had moments of dread even to think of the possibility. I had only been a camper a couple times growing up, and as a college student I was not entirely sure what a summer at Spitzer meant. I was shy and not entirely sold on being outside all summer. Could I survive a summer? Was I cut out for it? Little did I know, one summer would turn into four, and my life would be transformed.

I have been a school counselor in small rural districts in North Dakota for the past eight years. I know I am a better counselor because of my experience at camp. During my Spitzer summers, I learned what it meant to have "eyes to see." At camp we learn to look for the little things: a branch fallen on the boardwalk that needs to be moved, how kids are responding to the Bible



study, or which parent might need help carrying dinner plates. Paying attention to the little things helped me be more responsive to the needs of others, as well as prompt me to show more care with God's creation and people. Now, during my days at school I have "eyes to see" the kids who haven't eaten breakfast, the students who are dealing with the weight of stress, and the unspoken needs that haven't been addressed yet.

My time at Inspiration Point has instilled in me the deep love and value God has for His people. We serve a God who cares about the giants we face and the unspoken worries in our hearts. When reading Genesis, we learn of the plight of Hagar as she is feeling abandoned and at a loss. God showed her His care, and it reads, "She gave this name to the LORD who spoke to her: 'You are the God who sees me,' for she said, 'I have now seen the One who sees me.' (Genesis 16:13, NIV) It's incredible. We are seen by God. We are loved by God.
