

## **GREETINGS FROM IPOINT**



What a winter! The past few months were filled with snow, wind, and frigid temps, but events at Inspiration Point kept rolling along. Campers have enjoyed the excellent winter conditions as they skated, went cross-country skiing or snowshoeing, or raced down the tubing hill.

Sometimes we get asked what we do when it isn't summer. Well, we usually have guests on site (18 days in January) and typically hold 210 days of events each year, which doesn't leave a lot of time to address other items. To give you a quick

idea, since last summer, when we haven't been serving guests, our staff has registered thousands of summer campers and retreat guests, planned menus, regularly cleaned 50,000 sf of facilities, repaired broken items, produced videos, traveled to churches, undergone training, written messages, planned worship services, interviewed and hired staff, built two offices, moved [literally] tons of snow, fundraised, and the list goes on.

This is all done so that camp can "provide time, space, and Biblical teaching so people encounter and follow Christ." A pastor who attended a recent retreat with his students wrote, "Camp gives me a chance to take my students to a distraction-free place to build stronger relationships and point them to Jesus." We believe there is no better place to do that and are awed by the work that the Lord does in the lives of people while they're here.

I hope you enjoy this issue of Inspirations. You'll find it filled with testimony to God's work, the reason for and value of a camp experience, and lots of information about what is to come in the months ahead. ## HELPING KIDS TRY SOMETHING NEW

When I had finished fourth grade, I was invited to go to camp with some kids from our church. Having never been there before, I wondered what to expect and remember the feelings of nervousness as the day approached. That is a common way people of all ages can react to new experiences.

Over the past several years, we have seen a decrease in kids' willingness to try new things. Why? There could be many reasons: a fear of failing, fearing the unknown, or something else. Sometimes kids are scared to try something they haven't done before because they think that "everyone else is an expert." It is a big step to go to camp for the first time, but kids who do learn to summon courage and depend on God to be with them have an opportunity to grow and build new skills and perhaps experience something they really love.



How can parents help their child face new experiences? Here are several ideas:

- 1) Continually work to expose them to new things
- 2) Try new things together, i.e., things that are new to you, too!
- 3) Celebrate small wins
- 4) Remind them of past wins when they were able to say, "I did it!"
- 5) Remind your kids that God goes with them. We are promised in the Scriptures, "Never will I leave you. Never will I forsake you." What a great way to learn this.
- 6) Tell your kids that you believe in them and encourage them. The word encourage literally means "to turn toward." Your encouragement helps them turn toward a new experience with wind in their sails.

Then, regardless of the outcome, emphasize their effort and any improvement that might be present. Sure, it is possible that they could fail. However, failure IS an option, and it can help them learn to cope, develop grit, and become more resilient, all vital skills for living in our 21st-century world.



# NO PLACE LIKE CAMP



A camper parent recently told of her son arriving at camp with one of his friends. Her son exclaimed to his friend, "Welcome to the best place on earth!" Years ago, another mom reported the story of her son's response to his teacher's question, "If you only had two weeks to live, what would you do?" Her son replied, "I'd sure try to squeeze in camp at Inspiration Point one more time." What is it about camp that elicits such feelings?

Truly, it is more than just the variety of recreation available, for there are many places in our world that offer more. It must be more than just the fun that will be had, for there are experiences that deliver beyond what camp can. So, what is it about camp?

Last summer, kids arrived at camp from 16 different states, coming from all different socioeconomic backgrounds and experiences. When they come together for a camp experience, there is a great leveling that occurs. You see, no one knows if your family has riches or struggles to get by. In fact, no one knows if you live with your family or not. Camp is a place of fresh starts and new beginnings, leveling the playing field. Kids get to be just kids.

Time and again, campers tell us that one of their favorite things about camp is that they feel safe here – physically, socially, and emotionally. There is an atmosphere of welcome and participation, and friendships are formed between who in other circles would be opposites.

Kids need time and space to consider who they are and the call on their lives by a holy God who loves them so. Whether talking with camp staffers or spending time alone reading their Bible, camp provides ample opportunity for them to assess their lives, respond to God's invitation to follow, and learn that they are not alone in the journey. 
