

God makes an impact through camp that extends beyond its borders. Youth campers from 14 different states arrived at Inspiration Point this summer. Word is spreading! One must only look at the world in which we live to understand the increasing need for this ministry where young and old are drawn into a closer relationship with God and leaders are equipped for service in their home churches and communities.



In just a few years, with the help of hundreds of committed and generous donors, Inspiration Point has purchased more than 1,000 acres for ministry that now provide year-round accommodations for 260 people. Showers, restrooms, a swimming pool, an office, two amphitheaters, and 17,000 square feet of dining, recreation, and meeting space have been constructed. Two buildings were moved from the old

property that flooded, and six suites were built below them. We were also able to repurpose a shelter into a 5,000-square-foot, year-round, multipurpose room and build a large maintenance center.

Because of the Lord's provision through generous people, we are already 80% of the way toward having all this paid for. 

BEYOND THE POINT

BRENT ROGNESS

Am I really qualified to get this job? Why would I be chosen over dozens of other applicants? What makes me stand out?

Navigating the transition from high school or college to "real life" and unlocking a career can be an overwhelming challenge. The trail to vocational independence is often littered with obstacles of anxiety and self-doubt. It's the kind of stuff that makes you frantically call your emergency contacts before you've finished entering them onto your job application. The reality is, most business owners prefer to hire



for attitude and train for skill, building a team that has a tangible ability to serve others. Whether the measurement is in blue ribbons, top rankings, or online stars, success in business and life is predicated on servanthood and servant leadership.



MINISTRY PERSPECTIVE MARK JOHANNESEN

In a world filled with constant notifications, distractions, and temptations, one of the most significant things that churches can do is to help create opportunities to get students to camp. At camp, many of the distractions are set aside, and students are given an opportunity to focus on their relationships with each other while being challenged by the gospel. Because of these hoped-for outcomes, one of my goals as a pastor is to get students away for retreats two to three times per year. And as a bonus, when I attend an IPOINT sponsored camp, they do all the heavy lifting and provide a great weekend leaving me with the task of just inviting students to attend and helping them to process how God has been working in them during the weekend. If getting away to rest and refuel was important to Jesus (see Mark 6:31 as one example) then we should be encouraged towards that as well.

In the world that we're living in, my husband and I have found that camp has been one of the only experiences we can give our kids that is consistent. That's hard to come by these days! All of the guesswork and worry is taken out of sending our kids to camp. Whether it's a week in the summer or a weekend in the fall or winter, we KNOW that our kids will be safe, incredibly well cared for, poured into, and they'll know more about what it looks like to follow Jesus.

Camp offers concentrated time in creation. There is time and space to ask questions, and for spiritual conversations. It's a safe place for our kids to learn independence. They've gained incredible relationships with camp staff and their peers. Can these things happen outside of camp? Sure, they can. Camp fills those holes differently, though. Do we need to eat foods like broccoli? Yep. Does broccoli fill a different need in our bodies than bananas? Sure does!

The experiences that only camp can offer are such an important part of our kiddos' overall spiritual health, which is why we continue year after year to make the investment. It will always be worth it!



SCHOOL PARTNER

Over the past several months, Inspiration Point has had the opportunity to partner with schools from around the state of Minnesota, Students are shaped tremendously by time spent with their school community, and because of that, we count it a great honor to invest in them. Since April, we have welcomed the following groups to our site:



Henning Preschool, Henning Elementary, Hillcrest Sonshine Kids, New Testament Christian School, Bertha-Hewitt Elementary, Wadena-Deer Creek Middle School, and Avail Academy (Junior & Senior High). Each group has been met with individualized plans, tailored to the needs of its students. Some groups have participated in Outdoor Education classes, including studies on ecosystems, orienteering, geology, botany, animals, and weather. Others have engaged in Adventure Course, allowing them to grow in communication, leadership, teamwork, speaking words of encouragement, problem-solving, understanding differences, trusting one another, and practicing patience. These school groups arrive at our site with a distinct and unique culture, and we are grateful for the chance to speak truth and life into each one of them. Biblical principles are taught through time in creation and through the strengthening of community, and by God's grace, we have witnessed an immense amount of fruit!

KATIE KOCINSKI HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL AT AVAIL ACADEMY

One challenge that can show itself in most high school cultures is that of disunity, whether that comes in the shape of cliques, popular/unpopular students, or even in differences of opinion. One of our hopes for our time at Inspiration Point was, as a school, to intentionally focus on fostering a community of unity among our high school students. The staff at Inspiration Point not only provided safe and protected space for our students and staff to explore what unity looks like as Christians, they also guided students through thoughtful scripture reflection, group discussion, and trust-building activities. Each of these experiences was fully relevant to helping our students dig deep into what it means to live in unity and challenged them to grow deeper in their faith and deeper in their relationships with one another. Our entire high school left Inspiration Point feeling encouraged and better equipped to be inclusive and unified, not just as a school, but as the Body of Christ being lived out at school.
