

Josh designed posters and put them up around school and talked to his classmates. He asked the children's director at Bethesda in Eau Claire if he could use the Action Bibles they use in Sunday School for his study. She was so helpful and gave him several Bibles to use. He then sat down with me and developed his lesson plan for the study, which included a question sheet for the students to use. The Bible Book Club began last spring and is going this fall again too!



I remember quiet, raw conversations with campers during the summers I spent on staff as a counselor, and today, I look around at the people closest to me, and some of our deepest connections come through our shared experience at camp, which has grown far beyond the tiny penisula we call Inspiration Point.

I count it privilege to have a small role in the lives of several students/youth through my roles on staff at Park Christian School (Moorhead, MN), and being involved with Confirmation/Junior High students at Triumph West church (West Fargo, ND). I've had the joy of bringing groups of students out to camp for several different events or activities, and each time, turning onto the gravel road, I feel this sense of anticipation. I want to turn to the kids riding in my vehicle and say, "This is the best camp ever - you have to try it!" My time spent with students out at camp has been powerful, and not surprising, a place of connection. As I've witnessed students interact at camp, I see a list that grows of lessons they've learned together, laughs we've shared together, times spent in prayer together, and everyone leaves camp just a tiny bit more connected than we were when we came.

Even more than the best chocolate chip cookie, or the worst sour milk, I want kids to know camp, because I want them to know Jesus. It's been my experience that those go hand in hand. What I've 'tasted' through my time at camp is a place of deep connection, shared experiences, joy and exposure to an incredible savior - Jesus Christ. And when we've known and experienced something that good, how can we not turn to those around us and say, "You've got to try this!" I'm so thankful for camp and for the way it has and continues to impact my life. I'm thankful for the opportunity to continue to expose students to the incredible ministry of IPOINT.
