of the most solid friendships, taught me valuable leadership skills, and spurred on my spiritual growth.

Inspiration Point cultivates lifelong friendships. MORE CAMP = MORE KIDS = MORE IMPACT INSPIRATION POINT EXPANDS TO MEET GROWING NEED

For more than 50 years Inspiration Point has been a gathering place for people of all ages. Nestled in the lake country of Minnesota, this Christian camp and retreat center has been a favorite of children, youth, adults and families.

While steady growth has occurred over its lifetime, summer youth camp attendance has swelled the past several years to where hundreds of kids must be turned away every summer due to full camps. We know the good that God provides through camp as we witness the lives of thousands impacted every year. Recently a high schooler said, "It is difficult to express what I've learned at camp over the years because I realized that it is core to me! Camp has formed me into who I am!" When kids want to attend but cannot because there is no room, it is obvious that something had to be done, for camp leadership desires that all kids have the opportunity to flourish at camp.

At the same time, the tiny peninsula on Spitzer Lake has been built out as far as possible with no more room to expand. Therefore, the board of directors put together an aggressive plan to locate, secure, and build a second property that will ensure that there is room for everyone.

Late in the summer of 2018 that plan took shape with the acquisition of a spectacular property located in the wooded lake country of Minnesota, only 12 miles east of Spitzer Lake. As a former private estate, it already contains many gorgeous buildings that Inspiration Point will be able to use as is. Others, like a shop and a garage, will be remodeled and repurposed to house our office and a craft room. Construction has been taking place at a vigorous pace, with nine cabins already being erected and a swimming pool and several other buildings under construction as well.

We are thrilled to announce that this new camp, Inspiration Point at Twin Oaks, will open in June 2020! This beautiful new location will be the camp home for Inspiration Point's youngest campers. Beginning in 2020 all first through forth graders will attend camp at Twin Oaks. The benefits are many:

- We will be able to specialize, creating a space that is built for this age group. As an example, campers will be able to have a blast in our swimming pool!
- Campers will enjoy smaller staff to camper ratios, meaning each one will receive more individual attention.

- 3. Parents will be able to have their kids of different ages attend camp at both locations simultaneously, meaning fewer roundtrips and, essentially, gaining weeks back in the summer!
- 4. We will be adding weeks of camp for our older campers at our Spitzer Lake site, meaning campers won't have to be turned away anymore, and there will be more choices for families, easing the pressure on their summer schedules.

The new property will also host a week of camp for fifth and sixth graders, three family camps, and many rental groups. It will be available for family reunions, church retreats, and other events throughout the year.

Inspiration Point at Twin Oaks will have the same highly trained, committed, and fun staff. The culture of safety and care will remain. The food will be tasty, and the focus on the message of the Gospel will still be powerfully present.

We need your help in making this necessity and great opportunity possible. We are looking for volunteers in the coming months to help drywall, tape and texture, insulate, paint, clean, assemble bunkbeds, and more. Also, we invite you to join the hundreds who are supporting this bold endeavor financially. One staffer told the story of a time when Jim was asked if it was OK for a cabin group to "swim" in the huge mud puddles on the lawn following a rain. Jim said, "No, I'd rather you didn't, but give me about 30 minutes." As the story goes, he returned to the counselor to say, "I've got a big slip-and-slide set up on the hill for you to use instead!" He was skilled at helping people make memories, and he loved to make their days special whenever he could.

While we mourn our loss, we rejoice that Jim is present with His Savior, and we look forward to reuniting with him one day.

BEYOND THE POINT

ISAAC ERICKSON It is quite impossible to forget my time spent on Spitzer Lake, which included two summers

on summer staff and nine months of Checkpoint in between. During the evenings and weekends of Checkpoint, I stumbled upon a different pace of life on the peninsula. Little did I know that this extra time was going to be how the Lord prepared me for future vocational ministry.

During Checkpoint, class was at 8:30 AM. Most days I would roll out of bed at 8 o'clock to get ready, until one day, by God's grace, I decided to wake up 15 minutes earlier so I could read my Bible. This was the first time I had ever intentionally made a plan to read my Bible, and somehow, I kept doing it. It started out as work. Those 15 extra minutes in bed always seemed like a good idea, but it turns out that God's grace extends way beyond the cross and into the daily fabric of our lives, giving us strength to do that which our sinful nature does not want to do. These humble 15 minutes were the inception of a life spent with God; what started out as work turned into an integral and joyous part of my day. Eventually I started to pray and discovered the gift of fellowship with the Eternal God, my Heavenly Father.

Through being in the word and in prayer, the Lord began to transform my life. The Lord transforms lives as we spend time with him. In Acts 4, Peter and John are before the Sanhedrin. Verse 13 says, "When [the Sanhedrin] saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled. ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus." Peter and John had spent three years with Jesus and had been forever changed. They had no fear as they stood before the Sanhedrin and boldly proclaimed the gospel of Christ Jesus.

In a world with an abundance of information at the tips of our fingers, we need transformation more. A simple Google search will render as much information as we can imagine. Transformation happens when we are with Jesus. I can personally say that time with Jesus happens more easily at camp. Worldly distractions are minimized, time is maximized, and you join in with creation glorifying the Creator. This is how and why camp has such a huge impact on so many lives, young and old: time. The Lord was preparing me for vocational ministry during my time at camp, because my time at camp was spent with Him.
