

CHECKPOINT TURNS FIVE

In the first week of September, nine students arrived to begin a new year of CheckPoint. I was reminded of the day five years ago when we launched CheckPoint with four students and a plan for training them with the knowledge, skills and dispositions that would prepare them well for a lifetime of ministry. This year, as we begin our fifth class of CheckPointers, our current class of nine brings the total number of CheckPointers, current students and graduates, to 40. We have studied, evaluated and improved CheckPoint through these first five years, but our commitment to ministry and leadership training has never wavered.

As of May 2017, 31 young adults have graduated from CheckPoint. Of those graduates, 18 have gone on to serve in either full-time or part-time paid positions in a congregation or ministry organization. The others have become valued volunteer leaders in a wide range of positions. CheckPoint grads are currently serving many as leaders in children's ministry and youth ministry, as worship leaders, as small group/bible study leaders, in young adult ministry, and in church staff positions like administrative assistant, receptionist and church secretary. Others have gone on to take positions in schools and in communities working with children or youth and are using the skills they learned at CheckPoint to speak into the lives of people who may not otherwise have opportunities to hear Truth, spoken in love, by someone who genuinely cares about them.

Looking back on the past five years, it is clear that CheckPoint is making a difference. One of the first CheckPoint graduates said that the things he learned in CheckPoint have been "incredibly long-lasting lessons that are very valuable in all areas of [his] youth ministry." A pastor of a congregation that hired a CheckPointer said, "He came to us equipped, ready to jump into ministry, and ready to become a part of our ministry team. He was ready to take on whatever we asked of him."

As we look forward to another year of CheckPoint, please pray that God will work in the lives of these students and prepare them for the ministries in which they will serve. He has been faithful to this for the past five years. I know He will be faithful to this class

In addition to scholarship funds provided by churches, Inspiration Point was able to award a total of \$47,387.50 to help 214 kids get to camp this summer. These campers were able to hear the lifechanging message of the Gospel because of the generosity of donors. Here is just one example of the impact a camp scholarship made in a kid's life:

"I really appreciate the time taken to call ahead to learn about our son's special needs. The care in being proactive was very professional and extremely kind! Camp helped him conquer his limitations and move forward in maturity. This was a huge accomplishment for him! He was accepted in a group for the first time in his life. He came home so excited about his faith and even asked if he could start helping at church. We hit a milestone with him going to camp, and it meant the world to receive a scholarship or else it wouldn't have been financially feasible due to medical bills."

ADVENTURE COURSE

Our 35-event low ropes course plays a major role in the summer program at Inspiration Point, and we aspire to use it more during the school year to encourage personal and interpersonal growth. "What is Adventure Course?" you might ask. It's kind of hard to describe and better understood once you experience it, but we hope this explanation will give you a glimpse.

Adventure Course is a series of teambuilding activities that involve problem solving, decision making, perseverance, cooperation, communication, respecting personal differences, and leadership/followership. Participants grow in confidence, interpersonal skills, patience, resilience, appreciation of others, problem solving, and more. We combine two cabins of students (about 16 people) and by the end of a week, they bond through the challenges that encourage them to communicate face-to-face and trust one another.

Inspiration Point's Adventure Course has also been used for teambuilding among sports teams, retreat groups guests and school groups. The 7th grade students, along with their 11th and 12th grade peer mentors, from Wadena-Deer Creek Public Schools have grown through Adventure Course for the past 24 years. The school receives a grant to bring these students to Inspiration Point each year, so they can learn the skills mentioned above and form a solid foundation from which they can build at the beginning of the school year.

Oxford Economics Research firm recently asked employers which skills they'll need most in the next five to ten years, and the results came back with priorities including relationship building, teaming, co-creativity, brainstorming, the ability to manage diverse personalities, and empathy. (Fortune magazine, July 23, 2015). These soft skills are exactly what participants in Adventure Course gain!

Leaders of school groups, coaches, employers, men's or women's groups: if you are looking for a way to strengthen your team in the soft skills, maybe an afternoon on the IPoint Adventure Course is just what you need. I know for my sister and the two other women who travel to camp with us, it is their favorite time each year, and we begin talking about it and looking forward to it months ahead of time!

I'm so thankful that there is a Christ-centered program especially designed for adults with special needs and that Inspiration Point equips counselors to love these beautiful children of God in such an amazing way. Pathfinders meets the spiritual needs of these adults at their levels of understanding – and how fun it is to see them worship the Lord with unrestrained joy!

Everyone involved is blessed immensely, even the caregivers who get to tag along!
