Inspiration Point's impact reaches far beyond our peninsula. Every summer we send teams of staff to communities across the country to lead day camps and bring the message of the Gospel to kids. This fall we received a letter from a mom who shared with us the impact day camp made on a little girl from California.

"This past summer we brought our neighbor's daughter to Day Camp. She only comes to our community in the summer; otherwise she lives in California. She and my daughter write to each other quite often, and her last letter moved me deeply. At one point in the letter to my daughter, she writes:

The next thing I want to tell you is that because my grandma came at Christmas I got to go to church. You're probably thinking, 'Don't you go to church every Sunday?' Sadly no. My mom doesn't believe in God. Plus, I don't have a Bible.

On the back of the letter, she closes by writing from memory the whole song, "Your Love Is Deep," that she learned from Day Camp. God opened her eyes wide to His love for her, and I believe that he granted her faith at Day Camp. Even in California, half a year after Day Camp, God has kept that song in her mind – a testament to His great love for her. I hope she returns this summer so she can go again."

BEYOND THE POINT

Camp is not just a destination or an experience; it's a launch pad to something bigger and great. We love hearing stories of how former staffers take what they learned at camp and apply it beyond The Point.

KATIE JO LARSON (SUMMER STAFF 2007-2015)

While most teachers are thrilled to have summers off, I was thrilled to work at camp during my first five years of teaching. I worked at camp prior to teaching, but my summers at camp

were even more meaningful to me when I started teaching and while I taught. I have my undergrad in education, but my time at camp prepared me for teaching more than any classroom experience I gained in college. While I learned content in college, I learned about caring about kids and teaching their hearts at camp. I teach in a public school and don't often have the opportunity to share my faith. However, every day I have the opportunity to be Light in my classroom.

One phrase that I learned at camp that I think about often is: "The issue is not the issue." At camp, we learned that kids often acted out, not because of what I saw occurring at the moment. The reason for acting out was often a much deeper issue. I apply this daily in my classroom as I see kids acting or reacting in certain ways. I know that the 55 minutes a day that I see them is just a small piece of their world. While I can't fix the deeper issues, I can pray for my students and love them with Christ's love, just like I was able to do at camp.

BEN BIGAOUETTE (SUMMER STAFF 2006-2009)

Two of the areas that God helped grow in me during my time at Inspiration Point were seeing the value that other people have and the importance of relationships. Through my time interacting with campers and families, God showed me, firsthand, the incredible value He places on people, and He helped grow in me a love and appreciation for others. One of those ways was through relating to others and sharing life with them -- the high points and low points. Being able to value someone else is a great way to share the love of Christ and help bring them into a deeper relationship with Him. Not only is this essential to who God is, but it is also built into the fabric and culture of Inspiration Point.

This gift that was impressed upon me during my time at camp has been invaluable to me in my current role in ministry. I currently serve as an Associate Pastor at Oak Hill Church in Bloomington, MN, where I get to put this into practice every day. It is amazing to see God work through me as I relate to others and share the love, joy, peace, and hope that can only be found through Christ. It is exciting to be a part of God's continuing ministry to His people and to really appreciate His creativity through the lives of people I meet and interact with. I am thankful for the years that I spent being shown that very truth on the shores of Spitzer Lake.



TRACI (MILLER) WEINREIS (SUMMER STAFF 2010-2012)

I will forever be thankful for the three summers I worked on summer staff at Inspiration Point. God taught me so many things those summers, and I had no idea the ways He would continue to use the training I received at camp long after my summers on staff were over. While working at camp, the Lord taught me how to rely on Him for strength, that love is an action that looks like something, and that His plans are better than mine.

My husband and I are now one of a few youth leaders at our church. Our church is small and doesn't have an actual youth pastor. Because of this, we are more a part of the planning process for our Wednesday night youth group than we typically would be in a bigger church. Now, a youth group leader is not a role I'd ever imagined having — I'm more of a behind-the-scenes person — but as I learned at camp, God's plans are better than mine! I've been able to draw from camp training as I build relationships with the high school girls in my small group. God is so good, and it's amazing to look back at all the things He perfectly put in place that continue to impact my life now!
